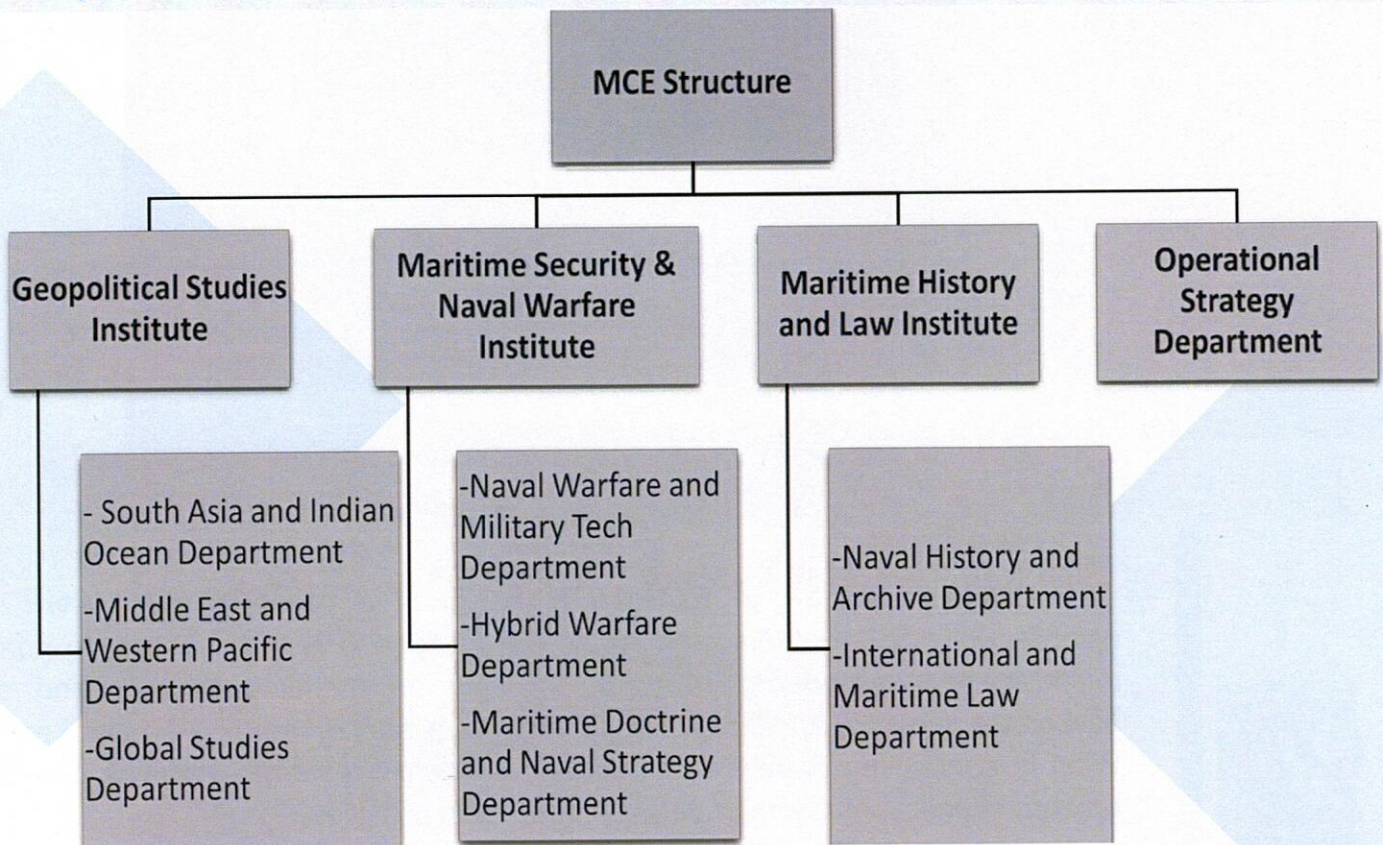
Vision

Organisational Structure



Geopolitical Studies Institute

The Geo-Political Studies Institute conducts research on global and regional power politics, strategic alignments, and their maritime implications. The institute undertakes research-driven and strategic activities at the subject-specific level. Additionally, Geopolitical Studies Institute remains committed to its core mandate i.e., conducting in-depth geopolitical analysis and assessing policy impacts while maintaining close coordination with other institutes.



Maritime and Naval Warfare Studies Institute

The Institute is focusing on maritime security and naval strategy, along with naval force structures, emerging technologies, hybrid threats, and maritime doctrines. It also emphasizes capacity building through training modules, war-gaming, and scholarly publications, while fostering interdisciplinary coordination with other institutes.



History and Lawfare Institute

The institute leads research in naval history, maritime law, and ethical perspectives relevant to maritime security. By integrating historical insights, international maritime law, and Islamic perspectives on conflict and trade, the Institute develops a unique knowledge base to support national maritime policy and institutional objectives.

OUTREACH

MCE is actively strengthening its ties with academia to develop future maritime thinkers. The outreach department is driving youth and scholar involvement by extensively promoting research among university students. Key programs, such as the Inter-University Essay Competition (IUEC), internships, seminars, and workshops, are attracting wide participation from across Pakistan. MCE also effectively utilizes social media and regularly hosting specialised events to engage directly with students. These activities are successfully nurturing a young generation who are becoming highly knowledgeable in maritime affairs.



Seminars/workshops

MCE actively engages with policymakers, academicians, and scholars at leading think tanks, as it works to advance the cause of maritime security and the Blue Economy both at home and abroad. MCE achieves this through the continuous conduct of regular seminars, major conferences, specialized workshops, and table-top discussions, which bring together subject matter experts in coordination with NHQ.



Maritime Security Workshop (MARSEW)

MARSEW takes center stage for national maritime awareness by actively convening policymakers, military officers, academics, and industry leaders. MCE facilitates high-level academic sessions and field visits, which provide participants with firsthand exposure to the complexities of maritime security and the Blue Economy. This widely acclaimed workshop has educated hundreds of leaders, fostering an integrated approach to advancing Pakistan's maritime sector.



Maritime Essay Competition

MCE organizes an annual Maritime Essay Competition to promote original research and fresh perspectives. The competition draws contributions from students, young professionals, and scholars focused on contemporary maritime challenges.



Courses

Executive Leadership Course (XLC): A three-week preparatory course designed for senior officers prior to their enrollment in NSWC. The curriculum provides an intensive focus on geo-strategy, economy, and maritime security, integrating these subjects with the core principles of statecraft, military strategy, and maritime strategy.

Maritime Potential Course (MPC): A two-week introductory course for fresh university graduates. MPC is designed to build foundational knowledge of maritime security, the Blue Economy, and overall maritime awareness.

Internship for University Students (IUS): This intensive eight-week internship is for post-graduate students. The program effectively combines in-depth academic study with hands-on field attachments, providing firsthand exposure to maritime security, the Blue Economy, and naval roles. IUS simultaneously focuses on developing the interns' research, academic, and creative skills.
