

Roundtable Discussion on Ocean Governance

On 03 Jul 25, MCE hosted a Round Table Discussion on "Ocean Governance" at PNWC, Lahore. Eminent speakers including, Prof. Dr. Sikander Ahmed Shah (LUMS), Cdr (R) Jawad Akhtar (MoMA), and Cdr (R) Khalid Rashid SI(M) (NIMA), shared insights on the evolving concept of ocean governance, distinguishing it from the Law of the Sea for its inclusive and participatory approach aligned with UN SDG 14. The panel highlighted oceans' global significance for trade, food security, and energy, while addressing challenges of overexploitation and maritime mismanagement. Emphasizing Pakistan's untapped maritime potential, speakers urged immediate policy action to strengthen ocean governance and unlock the true potential of Blue Economy.





Familiarization Visits

On 24 Jul 25, MCE hosted officers of the Pakistan Administrative Service (PAS) attending Mid-Career Management Course (MCMC) at the Civil Services Academy (CSA).



Led by Dr. Faisal Zahoor, the delegation attended an interactive session chaired by Cdr (R) Faisal Shabbir, Director MCE, featuring briefings on MCE's vision, structure, and academic pursuits. MCE Research Associates Ms. Javaria Shaikh and Mr. Ahmad Ibrahim delivered presentations on "Pakistan's Maritime Potential" and "Traditional and Non-Traditional Security Threats to Pakistan in Maritime Domain", respectively. 

During the visit, both think tanks shared their ongoing contributions and explored avenues for mutual cooperation. The meeting concluded with a commitment to pursue joint initiatives and foster continued knowledge exchange.


Session-I explored the transforming geopolitical environment in IOR by taking into account Pakistan's adaptive strategy amid intensifying Sino-US competition, the impact of evolving alliances on future of regional security architecture, efficacy of institutional framework for regional co-operation in IOR, and lessons from May 2025 crisis and Nuclear Tetraplex in IOR. Session-II deliberated on military outlook of IOR. Ceomprehensive deliberation on topics including emerging technologies in naval domain and its impact on deterrence stability in IOR, role of air and space power in naval domain, prospects and challenges for arms control environment in IOR.

Ms. Hina Rabbani Khar, Chief Guest Session-II, highlighted that the world is in a chaotic transition towards a new power order. She argued that the U.S.-China rivalry reflects hegemonic, not great power, contestation—where China seeks stability, not dominance. She praised Pakistan's strategic gains after Operation Sindoor for reshaping regional security perceptions



Conference on "Shifting Tides: Strategic Realignments in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR)-One Year On"



MCE held its 2nd annual conference titled "Shifting Tides: Strategic Realignments in Indian Ocean Region - One Year On" at PNWC on 25 Sept 25. Split into two sessions, the conference sought to reevaluate the evolving geopolitical, geostrategic and technological developments in the IOR over the past year. President MCE, R/Adm Sohail Ahmed Azmi SI(M) welcomed the honorable speakers and worthy audience. Lt Gen (R) Kidwai, in his keynote address, warned about the growing military threat emanating from the sea, identifying it as a "startegic blind spot" in Pakistan's traditional land focussed military calculus. Gen (R) Zubair, Chief Guest Session-I, cautioned that the Indian Ocean's emerging multipolar contest, and India's assertive naval build-up and nuclear proliferation, poses existential threat to Pakistan. Reiterating Pakistan's principled stance, he affirmed that Pakistan seeks no confrontation but will not accept coercion or encirclement.








Ms. Syeda Fizzah Shuja appeared in the podcast by CRIMA titled "Ocean Literacy in Pakistan: Building a Maritime Nation" on 17 Jul 25. She deliberated upon the importance of ocean literacy, why it matters for Pakistan's future, and what steps are needed to cultivate a maritime-aware society.

On 28 Jul 25, MCE hosted a Table Top Discussion under the 6th Executive Leadership Course (XLC). Dr. Rabia Akhtar, Dean, University of Lahore, spoke on "Emerging Technologies in Naval Warfare," highlighting the impact of AI autonomous systems, and cyber capabilities on naval modernization. R/Adm Javed Iqbal HI(M), Deputy President NDU, discussed maritime hybrid warfare and the rise of grey-zone operations in the Asia-Pacific and Indian Ocean Region. The session concluded with an interactive discussion with XLC led by Dr. Marriyam Siddique and Dr. Maira Afzazze, faculty at MCE, on IR Concepts and Strategic Domains.



On 13 Aug 25, Cdr (R) Faisal Shabbir delivered a talk on "Protecting Our Waters, Preserving Our Freedom: Maritime Sustainability for an Independent Pakistan" during a webinar organized by CRIMA–MUL in collaboration with MCE and NIMA. He emphasized the strategic value of Pakistan's maritime resources, threats to the Indus Delta, and the need for Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP) to align sustainability with security and regional cooperation.





Maritime Centre of Excellence (MCE) at Pakistan Navy War College (PNWC), Lahore, in collaboration with Centre for International Strategic Studies (CISS), Islamabad, hosted a workshop on "Strategic Matters" on 29 Jul 25. The workshop's primary objective was to enhance participants' understanding of critical issues related to strategic stability, nuclear deterrence and non-proliferation.

SESSION-I

The first session focused on Pakistan's strategic environment, evolving trends in nuclear proliferation regime, a comparison of Pakistani and Indian nuclear postures, and impact of nuclearization of the Indian Ocean. V/Adm Bilgrami emphasized that evolving geopolitics, emerging technologies, and India's aggressive posturing are transforming South Asia's security landscape.



Prof. Victor Gao (CCG) highlighted China's commitment to peace and partnership with Pakistan. Amb (R) Mansoor Ahmed Khan (BNU-BCPR) emphasized China's role in the Global South and the need to address global imbalances. Dr. Hassan Daud Butt called for resilience through digital and green initiatives and stronger regional linkages.

Amb (R) Babar Amin discussed reforms, new trade mechanisms, and Pakistan's upcoming SCO chairmanship (2026–27). The session focused on strengthening collective security, economic resilience, and regional cooperation.



He asserted that Pakistan's Full Spectrum Deterrence has preserved regional balance, demonstrated resilience during the May 2025 conflict, and will continue ensuring a firm response against any future Indian aggression.
